### **British Columbia Institute of Technology (BCIT)**

BCIT is one of British Columbia's largest post-secondary institutions. We offer practical career credentials designed for the workplace, including degrees, diplomas and certificates spanning Applied and Natural Sciences, Business and Media, Computing and Information Technology, Engineering, Health Sciences and Trades.

BCIT has five main campuses: the Burnaby campus; Downtown Vancouver Campus; Aerospace Technology Campus in Richmond at YVR Airport; Marine Training Campus in North Vancouver; and Annacis Island Campus in Delta. A wide range of full-time and part-time programs are offered at the Burnaby and Downtown campuses, whereas a smaller number of specialized programs are offered at the Aerospace, Marine and Annacis Island campuses. BCIT also has satellite campuses across the province.

The Burnaby Campus offers students the following: a 336-space student housing; a drop-in medical office, numerous sports courts, a weight room, aerobics classes, sports fields and a running track; extensive educational and personal counselling services; and a child care centre.



### **Coast Mountain College**

Coast Mountain College (CMTN) provides a variety of face-to-face and online programs for learners locally, from across Canada, and from abroad.

They are an accredited post-secondary institution that offers university transfer, applied and post-degree diploma programs, career and trades training, adult upgrading, field schools, and Canada's only Northwest Coast Art program.

The largest campus, in Terrace, has a state-of-the-art on-campus student housing building, library, cafeteria, and a fitness centre that is free of charge to all students. CMTN is proud to be the first institution in Canada with a traditional Longhouse on its campus grounds. They also have campuses in Smithers, Prince Rupert, Hazelton, and Haida Gwaii.

The College has many supports to help students succeed in their studies. Educational Advisors, First Nations Access Coordinators, Learning Assistance Specialists, and more can be found on each campus. Students can count on individual support from their instructors, small class sizes, and high quality education in any program they choose.



### **Douglas College**

Douglas College is one of the largest public colleges in British Columbia, serving 20,000 credit and continuing education students each year. At Douglas you can select from over 500 university courses, nine degree programs, over 30 career programs, as well as academic upgrading, continuing education and award-winning customized training options.

In career education, Douglas is recognized for their programs in: health care, community services, criminology, music, performing arts, business, and physical education and coaching.

Douglas College has two major campuses in New Westminster and Coquitlam. Major features include gymnasiums and fitness centers as well as major libraries at both campuses. The New Westminster campus features two floors of modern student computer labs and a 300-seat Performing Arts Theatre. The David Lam Campus (Coquitlam) features the three-story Health Sciences Center with specialized learning labs and facilities.



## University of British Columbia (UBC)

The University of British Columbia is one of the world's top research universities and is the largest university in the province of BC, offering two major campuses – in Vancouver and the Okanagan. Both campuses provide a wide range of student services as well as on-campus housing and recreational facilities.

*UBC Vancouver Campus:* Located 30 minutes from the heart of downtown Vancouver, UBC's Vancouver campus is one of the largest and most scenic campuses in Canada. Areas of study include programs in Architecture, Agricultural Sciences, Arts, Business Administration and Commerce, Dentistry, Education, Family and Nutritional Sciences, Fine Arts, Engineering, Forestry, Journalism, Law, Music, Nursing, Physical Education, Social Work, and Science. The campus also has two additional sites, one in the heart of downtown Vancouver at Robson Square, and another at Centre for Digital Media.

*UBC Okanagan Campus:* The Okanagan campus opened in Kelowna in 2005 offering an intimate learning community that attracts students from throughout the Okanagan region, across Canada, and 99 other countries for undergraduate and graduate programs in eight faculties and schools. UBC Okanagan's campus offers interdisciplinary and integrated programs in Applied Science, Arts, Business, Education, Nursing, Social Work, and Science.
